Six Nations Council and with the
consent of your department, decided
that Jasper W. Jones who married
one of our people, was allowed to
reside on our reserve and in course
of time his wife died and after her
death his case came up in the council
again, and the Chiefs again decided
that he should remain and reside
on the said reserve as long as he
lived. (I might say here that he is
not a member of the band) He lives
and occupies Lot No 7 N. E. 1/2 3rd Con.
Tuscarora. As he is now getting to be an
old man and perhaps won't live
much longer, I wish to inform
you that said lot belongs to our family
which are three of us left, "namely"
Nancy, Jacob, and Ezra. I claim on
behalf of my brother and sister that
we be located on said lot. As the
