adopted in China, as they soon will be, and when Western Canada is more fully populated and cultivated, as it soon must be, the enormous trade that can be developed and continued between the two countries will be of inestimable value to both. We feel that out of one evil, which has now been wiped out from our memory, great good will come.

On behalf of the Chinese residents of Vancouver, we desire to express our hearty appreciation of the patient and courteous hearing accorded to our fellow countrymen who were claimants before the Commission conducted by our guest, Mr. Mackenzie King.

To Owyang King, we owe a great debt of gratitude for his work last September in promptly collecting the evidence put forward by us.
