In further reference to your letter of the 6th Instant, expressing a desire to be located for land on the surrendered portion of the Whitefish River Reserve, I beg to say that it has been ascertained from the local Agent that there is plenty of land on the unsurrendered portion of the Reserve for all the members of the Band and their descendants, in view of which the Department considers that you should take up your residence on the Reserve, as you there can have what land you desire and be convenient to a good school, to which to send your children.
