I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 26th ultimo enclosing a letter from Mathew Mitachell, truent officer for the Lennox Island Indian School, in which he states that he was promised a salary of \$50.00 a year for this work by the late Superintendent.

In reply I beg to say that on the 16th of June, last, the Department informed Mr. Arsensult, then Indian Superintendent, that it would allow a salary of \$25.00 a year for a truent officer on the Lennox Island Reserve and authorized him to submit the name of a competent Indian to take up this work after the summer holidays. There was no mention of any higher salary being paid. I may add that this is the customary amount allowed for this service.
