
Ottawa, November 25, 1913.

Gentlemen,-

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 21st instant, and in reply to say that Mrs. Mary Dee has been recognized as the owner of lot 61, River range, Onondaga, but a location ticket under the provisions of the Indian Act cannot issue to Mrs. Dee for this lot without a resolution of the Band, as provided for by the said Act, and the local Superintendent, Brantford, has been written in the matter.

I may say that the sum of \$24.00, which was paid by Mr. Edward Deagle for sand removed from this lot, is being forwarded to the local Indian Superintendent for Mrs. Dee.
