the duplicate accounts. It is hoped that in future, the
Hospital will not send to the Department accounts which have
already been paid. Settlement has been made in all of the filowing kases enumerated by you, viz., Annie Awashish, Robert
Theia-Theia, Simon Couckick, William Kokotih, Joseph Kokitika
Annie Laloche, Madeleine Laloche, Homa Pom, Philippe Abraham
Maria Awashish, Lucy Awashish and Theophile Neguay. The che
enclosed pays the balance of accounts to date.

with reference to the case of Jonas Boucher who is tubercular and at present in Hospital and who will not recove I beg to say that he may remain in the Institution so long is he lives, upon the understanding that he will be cared for return for payment at the rate of \$15.00 a month. The Dopay ment is not prepared to pay at a higher rate in his case as recovery cannot be expected, and he will not require much nursing.

It is observed that you state that Simeon Awashia! in the Hospital and will likely have to remain there for a time. If his sojourn exceeds two months in duration paymen his case will also be made at the rate of \$15.00 a month.

with reference to the Hospital per diem charge in ordinary cases, which you state you propose increasing from the lat of May, I have to inform you that the Department wi not pay more than \$1.25 a day for Indians received and carefor at the Hospital.
