Greek Demand for Reparation and Restitution

In order to safeguard the claims presented in the Memorandum and to ensure the immediate satisfaction of a part of these claims, the Royal Hellenic Government desire that the following definite obligations be imposed on Germany and be inserted in the Armistice Terms:

1) All raw materials and commodities, especially timber, steel, oil paints, glass, electricity and telegraph wires, and all building materials in Germany shall be earmarked for the rebuilding of districts which have been destroyed by the enemy. (Similar measures were taken by the German Army of occupation in Greece, which earmarked, in addition, large quantities of foodstuffs, and medicines). Such materials as may be earmarked will be allocated by the Military Command to each Allied country in proportion to the destruction suffered by it at the hands of the Germans.

2) Two hundred locomotives, five hundred railway coaches and three thousand wagons shall be delivered to Greece.

3) Two thousand motor cars, and three thousand motor-lorries shall be delivered to Greece.

These must be in good working condition; the year of construction not to be earlier than 1937.

4) All industrial installations removed or otherwise damaged by the Germans shall be restored.

5) Certain kinds of industrial installations, such as shipbuilding and metallurgical works, shall be transplanted from Germany to Greece.
