

Feb. 1663,—The Great earthquake began and lasted interminally nearly six months.

Oct., 1690,—Sir William Phips demanded Frontenac to surrender, which he refused.

Two days later Phips began to bombard Quebec.

Oct. 24th,—Phips retired.

July 9th, 1759,—Wolfe landed his troops below Montmorency Falls.

Sept. 13th, 1759.—Wolfe began to land his troops at Wolfe's Cove and at ten o'clock had about 5,000 men on the Plains when the battle commenced.

April 28th, 1759,—De Levis defeated Murray at St. Foy.

Dec. 1775,—Montgomery and Arnold prepare to assault Quebec.

Jan. 1776,—Montgomery was killed and Arnold surrendered with 450 men.

May, 1776,—Carleton drove the Americans from Quebec.
