HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS. .

Any even numbered section of Dominion ands in Manitoba or the North-west Territories, excepting 8 and 36, which has not been homesteaded, or reserved to provide word tost for settlers, or for other purposes, may be homesteaded upon by any persons may the homesteaded upon by any persons and the provide word to be settled to the provide word of the provided with the provi

ENTRY.

Entry may be made personally at the loca land office for the District in which the land to be taken in situate, or if the homestender desires he may, on application to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, or the Local Agent for the district in which the land is situate, receive authority for some one to make entry for him. A few of \$10 is charged for a homestead entry

HOMESTEAD DUTIES.

A settler who has been granted an entry for a homestead is required by the provisions of the Dominion Lands Act and the amendmenta thereto to perform the conditions connected herewith, under one of the following plans:

(1) At least six months' residence upon and ultivation of the land in each year during the erm of three years.

(2) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) or any person who is eligible to make a homestead entry upon the provisions of this Act, resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for by such person as a houstead, the requirements of this Act as to residence prior to obtaining patent may be satisfied by such person residing with the father or mother.

(3) If a settler has obtained a patent for his homestead, or a certificate for the issue of the settle countersigned in themanner pre-scribed by this Act, and has obtained entry for a second homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the first homestead, if the second homestead is in the vicinity of the first homestead.

(4) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his household, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land.

The term "vicinity" used above is meant to indicate the same township or an adjoining or cornering township.

A settler who avails himself of the provision⁸ of Clauses (2) (3) or (4) must cultivate 30 acros of his homestead, or substitute 20 head of stock, with buildings for their accommodation, and have besides 30 acres substantially fenced.

Every homesteader who fails to comply with the requirements of the homesteader law is liable to have his entry cancelled, and the land may be again thrown open for entry.
