Notable Dairy Exhibit.—Messrs, R. A. Lister & Co., of Montreal, made an excellent display of high-class dairy apparatus at the Ontario Provincial Fat Stock Show, London, Ont., December 12th to December 15th. In the stockmen's pavilion was shown a No. 4 Melotte cream separator at work, driven by a Northey gasoline engine, skimming most thoroughly 1,000 lbs. of milk per day, obtained during the dairy cow test; it was really a hand machine easily converted into a "power" separator, with a capacity of 700 lbs. to 750 lbs. per hour. The firm turn out a hand machine of still larger capacity, which is capable of handling the milk from 50 cows, and, it is said, can be worked quite easily by a young man. 
