Mr. Roy Portelance, according to order, prefented a Bill for applying a further tum of one thoutand pounds out of any unappropriated monies in the hands of his Majefty's Receiver General, rowards the improvement of the inland navigation of this Province, between Montreal and Lake St. Francis, and the tame was received and read for the first time.

Mr. Mure, in the abence of Mr. Frobi/her, brought up, according to order, the report of the Committee of the whole Houfe, to whom was referred the Bill, to repeal an Ordinance made and paffed in the twenty fifth year of His Majefty's reign, intituled, "An Ordinance to " prevent the exportation of unmerchantable flour, and the falfe taring " of bread and flour cafks," to regulate the packing and infpection of flour, Indian meal, and bifcuit in future, and to fix a ftandard weight of wheat within this Province :—and he read the report in his place, and afterwards delivered the fame, with the Bill, in at the Table, where it was again read by the Clerk once throughout.
