ORDERED, That Thomas Cary, Editor of the news paper intituled, "*The Quebec Mercury*," for undertaking in his paper of yesterday, to give an account of the proceedings of this House be taken into Custody of the Serjeant at Arms attending this House.

Mr. *Roy Portelance*, according to order, presented a Bill for applying a further sum of one thousand pounds out of any unappropriated monies in the hands of his Majesty's Receiver General, towards the improvement of the inland navigation of this Province, between *Montreal* and Lake *St. Francis*, and the same was received and read for the first time.

On motion of Mr. *Roy Portelance*, seconded by Mr. *Mure*,

ORDERED, That the said Bill be read a second time to-morrow.

Mr. *Mure*, in the absence of Mr. *Frobisher*, brought up, according to order, the report of the Committee of the whole House, to whom was referred the Bill, to repeal an Ordinance made and passed in the twenty fifth year of His Majesty's reign, intituled, "An Ordinance to prevent the exportation of unmerchantable flour, and the false taring of bread and flour casks," to regulate the packing and inspection of flour, Indian meal, and biscuit in future, and to fix a standard weight of wheat within this Province:—and he read the report in his place, and afterwards delivered the same, with the Bill, in at the Table, where it was again read by the Clerk once throughout.
