Mr. President, and Honorable Gentlemen ;

I feel much gratified and obliged by your Address. I place the most perfect reliance on your assurance, that any measures submitted to your consideration, by my direction, will receive due attention; and that you are desirous of affording me, on every occasion, your best assistance to perform my duty to Her Majesty and the Colony.

A Message was brought from the House of Assembly, by Mr. Whidden, with the following Resolution:

Ordered, That the Hon. Mr. Dewolf, Mr. Stairs, Mr. Forrestall, Mr. Holdsworth, and Counts of H A Mr. Marshall, be a Committee of this House for the purpose of examining the Public Accounts, jointly, with a Committee of the Legislative Council.

The House proceeded to the consideration of the reasons given by Mr. Cutler for his Consideration of non-attendance, and, after some time spent in deliberation, the further consideration of the Sons for absence subject was postponed until a future day.

On motion, resolved, that Mr. Tobin, Mr. Morton and Mr. Bell, be a Committee of this Com. of Public House to join a Committee of the House of Assembly to examine the Public Accounts, Accounts of Coun and that the Clerk do acquaint the House of Assembly therewith.
