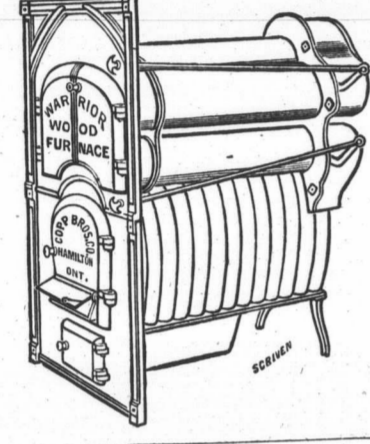

Members of the model class of '97 will take part in the model contest that is being arranged by the W. C. T. U. for the latter part of this month. Hon. John Dryden, Ontario Minister of Agriculture, will speak at Malorytown on Friday evening, Nov. 12th, and at Brockville on the evening of the 13th.

There are from 147 to 150 students registered at the Ontario agricultural college at present, a large number of them boarding out, there being no room at the college. Rumor is busy with Dalton McCarthy's name as the coming chief justice of the supreme court of Canada.

Wm. Morris and Andrew W. Gray collected from the church people of Otawa a fine load of cats, apples, etc., which they presented to their rectory, Rev. Mr. Moore, who with Mrs. Moore has lately returned from a short trip to Montreal and other points of interest.

A number of Athonians have signified their intention of attending the great horse-traders' convention at Frankville on Friday. All through the country sides are being specially groomed and fitted for the event and "shoot-money" will be in readiness to take advantage of any good swap offered.

The Sacrament of the Lord's Supper was dispensed in St. Paul's Presbyterian church last Sabbath morning when six persons united with the church. According to the new Act of the Ontario Legislature witnesses are to be paid for their services. Formerly in a police court they did not receive remuneration and had to pay their expenses. They will now be paid \$1.25 per day and mileage for their appearance at any trial in police court for indictable offences.

Owing to the snow-fall of Tuesday, which covered the roads and rendered the services of the mail coach impossible, it was decided to ask Prof. Campbell, Provincial Instructor in Road-making, to postpone his visit to Athens from 6-day to a more favorable season. A number of farmers who are waiting for the Professor were disappointed on learning that his visit had been postponed. His addresses in other parts of the county were very interesting and we shall refer to them next week.

The arrangements for the anniversary services of St. Paul's Presbyterian church to be held on the 21st and 22nd inst., are now about completed. Rev. W. T. Herridge of Otawa, whom the people of Athens have before held in the highest esteem, will preside at the services on Sabbath at 10 a. m. and 7 p. m. On Monday evening a Jubilee tea and entertainment will be held, at which Rev. Mr. Bryan of Westport, Rev. J. J. Wright of Lynd and local clergymen will deliver addresses which will be interspersed with musical and literary selections.

He will speak on the moral aspect of the question, and will be found very profitable as well as entertaining.

NEWS TOPICS OF A WEEK

ONARIO ELECTION CANDIDATES. At the South Ontario Liberal-Conservative convention held at Ottawa on Saturday the 10th inst., the following were nominated for the constituency: POLITICAL-IRREGULAR. The returns show that the Opposition in Ontario has secured a majority of seats out of thirty-five, and Sir William Whitehead is expected to resign within ten days.

THE DEAD. Rev. F. A. Gunner died at Lethbridge, Alberta, on Sunday, the 10th inst. The United States Government is said to be favorably considering reciprocity with Canada. One hundred and forty millions was paid in interest last year. Under threats of declaring her independence, Turkey has acceded to Bulgaria's demand for a loan of 200,000,000 francs.

THE RELIGIOUS WORLD. Archbishop Lewis and Mrs. Lewis have returned to Kingston after a year's absence. A thorough search is being made in the Vatican for a letter supposed to have been written by Pontius Pilate to Emperor Tiberius, referring to the crucifixion of Christ. It is stated in ecclesiastical circles in Rome that the Pope will shortly give his decision on the Manitoba school question, as the moment is regarded as favorable in view of the Canadian Canadian press since Mr. del Val's mission to Canada.

RAILROAD RUMBLINGS. The Grand Trunk Railway Company has sent checks to Montreal amounting to \$35,000, returning the car work bonus with interest. The insurance companies intend bringing a test case against the International Railway, to see if railway companies are responsible for fires caused by sparks from their engines. The Canadian Pacific Railway, the Canadian Northern Railway and the company have combined to reorganize the system of baggage transfer and delivery from the master carriers of Toronto and Montreal.

WILL GO OUT OF BUSINESS. The Farmers' Loan and Savings Company Toronto, Nov. 7.—George S. C. Bethune, manager of the Farmers' Loan & Savings Company, has informed the press that owing to the depression the fact that considerable unproductive property has come into the hands of the company and the margin of profits has been greatly reduced, the directors of the Farmers' Loan and Savings Company have decided to recommend to the shareholders the gradual winding up of the company by means of a voluntary liquidation.

Interest on debentures and deposits for the half year will be paid forthwith. The amount of the assets is largely in excess of the liabilities. The total sum due in Canada are about as follows: Deposits \$29,000,000, debentures \$200,000, and the total liability to banks is under \$60,000.
