London, Wednesday, Dec. 13.-The Wat Office publishes the following despatch from Gen. Buller :-Despatch from Gen. White, dated Dec. 11, says:-Last night Col. Metcalfe and 500 of the Second Rifle Brigade sortied to dapture a Boer howitzer on a hill.

They reached the crest without being discovered, drove off the enemy, and then destroyed the howitzer with when returning, Metcalfe found his retirement barred by the Boers, but he forced his way through, using his retirement barred by the Boers, but he forced his way through, using the bayonet only.

London, Wednesday, Dec. 13, 4.30 a.m.-With the exception of Sunday s sortle at Ladysmith, which the morning papers are unanimous in regard-ing as a brilliant piece of work, there are no further advices from the seat The Boers fear the British bayonets. This is illustrated in the result of previous sorties. It seems that in Sir Archibald's sally from Ladysmith; to capture the Boer guns, he British did not carry any bayonets. While they were storming the hill, the Boers, suddenly aroused from sleep, burst to the edge, and opened an indiscriminate fire on them. But just before the British secured a good position on this top of the hill, some one shouted in the rear, 'Fix bayonets and give them cold steel!' At this the Boers fled into the darkness. The Times, while praising Col. Metcalf's brilliant feat at Ladysmith, expressed the opinion that relief being now so near, such sorties are rather serious and it would be better for Gen.
