Launch at Hantsport.

Last Saturday afternoon saw the re-awakening of the ship-building industry at Hantsport, when the four-masted schooner, Margaret Dick, 1,500 tons, built by Messrs. Foley and Paugler, slid triumphantly and safely from her ways in the old North shipyard into the Avon River, riding the water without the slightest list. The launching took place at 2.45 o'clock and long before that time a large crowd began to collect from all parts of the surrounding country. Upwards of three thousand persons witnessed the event. At two thirty the workmen began to remove the blocks from underneath the hull of the vessel, and as the last block was removed the ship shuddered. Mrs. Frederick Porter of Halifax broke a bottle of champagne on the bow, and the Margaret Dick glided swiftly and smoothly down the ways and settled gently as she reached the water.

The Margaret Dick is a four-masted schooner, with handsome, long sweeping lines. Her dimensions are: length over all, 224 feet; width, 39 ft. 6 in.; keel, 179 ft.; depth, 18 ft. 6 in. Her gross tonnage is approximately 1,500 tons; her carrying capacity 1,800 tons. She is a yacht line model, designed by R. Huntly, of Parramatta. Her masts are 96 ft. high with 50 ft. topmasts, all being beautiful specimens of timber. Most of the lumber of which she is constructed is in Oregon fir. The master builders of the vessel were Messrs. David North and A. Newcombe. Her captain will be C. F. Dagnall, who has been on three torpedoed vessels, having been in command of the Dartmouth when she was sunk in the Bay of Biscay a few weeks ago. The Margaret Dick will be protected from U-Boats by two guns, one placed fore and one aft. Her quarters and fittings, although not yet completed, will be handsome and thorough.

The purchasers, The British Colonies Transportation Co., Ltd., of Toronto, were represented at the launching by Mr. Dick, one of the members of the firm, who stated that his firm intended sending the new vessel to Africa with a cargo of lumber. Her holds can accommodate a quarter of a million feet.

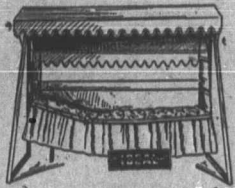
