

LETTER FROM MR. HOWE.

TO THE PEOPLE OF CANADA.

Without any mean compliance, and in the ordinary performance of public duties as a subject of the Crown, it has been my good fortune, on many occasions, to witness confidence and approbation...

When the principles for which we had contended had been established here in the winter of 1841, I went to Canada, and during that anxious fortnight in which the first United Parliament struggled for their recognition...

When in England, in 1862, I found that the mercantile classes were grumbling at the high tariffs of Canada, while the governing classes complained that the feeling of dissatisfaction was all but universal...

Of Detroit I am unwilling to speak, but I think I may say this—that there, as every where, while not forgetting that I was a Nova Scotian, and loving my native land with a strength of affection which is never disguised...

These were my sentiments deliberately formed and expressed in 1840 after "long and anxious reflection." They were the sentiments of the great party with which I was associated, and of the people of Nova Scotia.

In 1851 Mr. Johnson, then leading the Opposition, but who had been four years in office without proposing any such policy, laid a resolution on the table suggesting in general terms, that a union of the Provinces was desirable...

Resolved, That His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor be respectfully requested to put himself in communication with His Grace the Colonial Secretary and His Excellency the Governor General, and the North American Colonies, in order to ascertain the policy of Her Majesty's Government...

That I still desire and am prepared to promote any judicious measure that is calculated to elevate and strengthen British America, I need hardly assert; but that I am bound, by any action of my public life, to accept this Quebec Scheme of Confederation...
