PERSONS ARE HEREBY NOTIFE AND URGED TO COM-

We also desire to call to your attention the following sections of the Public Health Act of 1911:

RULE IV.—Any householder in whose house there shall occur a case of Smallpon. Cholera, Diphtheria, Scarlet Fever, Tuberculosis, Typhus Fever or Measles, shall immediately notify the Board of Health of that district of the same

RULE V.—When a physician knows or suspects that any person to whom he has been called is sick of or has died of, any di the diseases named in Rulo 4, he shall immedicately notify the local Board of Health of that district.

RULE VI.-Whenever a case of er or smallpox exists in any house or dwelling, a notice or placard shall be posted on or near the door of such house, stating that such disease exists therein, and no person shall remove such notice or plawthout the authority of the Local Board of Health of that dis-

RULE VIII.-Whenever the existence of any contagous disease in a house or in any public institution has been ascertained, or if there is reason to believe that one of the immates is suffering from any contagious disease, no occupant of such ouse or public institution shall change his residence without the consent of the Local Board of Heekh of that district.

RULE VII.-A right quarantine IF YOUR CHILD'IS CROSS, shall be placed upon any person

(a) Smallpox, Cholera er Typhus Fever antil such time as the Local Board of Hoalth shall permit the quarantine to be removed.

RULE XV-No person shall give

RULE XV—No person shall give or sell any articles, morchandise, products, milk, butter, bread, provisions, etc if such are coming from a house in which any of the diseases manded in Rule IV. exists

SEC. 80 (1) Before entering any child upon the register of any public school, or admitting such child to sall public school, there shall be produced by such child, or by its parents, or guardian: or some person acting on behalf of such child, a certificate, to the satisfoation of the terretain and for grown-ups.

PENALTIES SEC. 63 .Any rerson who shall wilfully violate any of the provisions of this Act, or wilfully disobey or resists any lawful order of the health officers, or of any Inspector appointed under this Act, or wilful ly obstructs any person ucting under the authority or employed i nthe execution of this act, or wilfulade and declared by the Lieutenanti-Governor in Council, or any by law, order or regulation by the Provincial Board of Hea'th, or any eguletion by any Local Boshd of Health or neclects or refuses to comply with such by-law, order or ns or with the requirements of this Act, in any manner whatso ever, or pulls down, defaces or de stroys any notice or placerd put up inder the authority of this Act, or of any by-law, rule, order or regular tion made hereunder, shall be liable ever such offence to a penalty
