TO-MORROW will be election day in the third district of Prince County, to fill the vacancy caused by the elevation of Hon. Mr. Arsenault to the Senate.

The trade returns for the fiscal year have been issued at Ottawa. The total exports are valued at \$110,716,737, a decrease of \$1,672,251 compared with the previous year.

The latest election returns from Great Britain give 306 Conservatives; 55 Unionists; 124 Liberals; 56 anti-Parliamentaries; 9 Parliaments. Total opposition, 189.

The fifth session of the seventh Parliament of the Dominion of Canada, which came to a close on Monday last demonstrated, like so many of its predecessors, the ability of the great Liberal-Conservative party, to conduct the business of this country.

On Monday last, at 2.30 p.m. the fifth session of the seventh Parliament of the Dominion of Canada, was prorogued, with the usual formalities, by His Excellency, the Governor-General.

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Domestic Parliament

On Monday last week Mr. Laurier, Leader of the opposition, made a long speech attacking the government's course on the school question.

Hon. Mr. Foster, on rising, was greeted with great cheering. He said Mr. Laurier was welcome to all the satisfaction he could get out of the recent ministerial crisis.

On Tuesday, on motion to go into supply, Dalton McCarthy moved the amendment: "This House has heard with regret the statements recently made defining the policy of the government respecting the Manitoba school question and is unwilling by silence to allow it to be assumed that at the session to be held in January next any more than at the present session it is prepared to pass a law to restore the system of separate schools of Manitoba on the lines of the remedial order of 21st March last."

Mr. St. Hubert, on rising to reply was loudly cheered. He said Mr. McCarthy had entered the political arena in Canada at too late a period. He should have been on the scene in 1870, when the questions of the rights of minorities were discussed and thoroughly understood by the great men who were the fathers of confederation a few years ago.
