WARNING!

IN THE INTEREST OF THE PUBLIC SAFETY.

The Rifle Range on the South Side Hill will be in constant use, from daylight till dark, for musketry practice, until our Regiment leaves for England.

All persons are therefore prohibited from approaching the Rifle Range within 200 yards from either side, or within 1,000 yards of the targets to the eastward.

Any unauthorized person so doing will be liable to arrest, besides incurring serious danger from rifle bullets.

A number of red flags will be used to indicate the Danger Zone. This prohibition does not extend to any part of the Hills west of the 800 yards Firing Point.

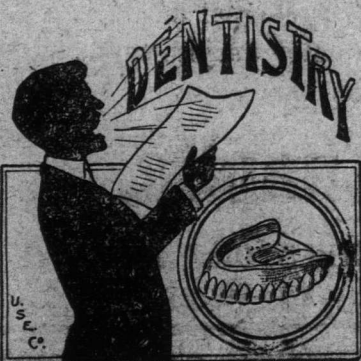

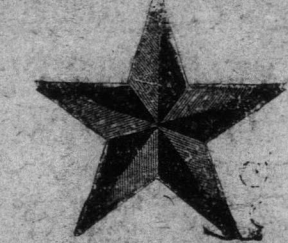

The Attention of the Public is Called to the Following Information:

The shooting season for Rabbits, Partridge, Curlew, Plover, Snipe and all Game Birds (except Capercaillie or Black Game) opens on September 21st this season.

Any person, except a traveller on a journey, found on the shooting grounds, carrying firearms, with or without dogs, between the first day of January and the twentieth day of September in any year, where such Game is known to frequent, shall be subject to a fine not exceeding fifty dollars and, in default of payment, to imprisonment for a period not exceeding one month.

Any person, except a traveller on a journey, found on Sunday carrying firearms, shall be subject to a fine not exceeding forty dollars and, in default of payment, to imprisonment for a period not exceeding one month.

Detectives will visit the various hunting grounds and all violators of the Game Laws will be severely dealt with by the Game and Inland Fisheries Board.
