NOTICE to FISHERMEN

The attention of the Board of Trade has been directed to the economy which is demanded from all in these times of distress. In a small way—but not unsubstantial—a considerable saving can be effected by our fishermen in the use of salt. The method of heavy salting very frequently results in more salt being used than can be absorbed by the fish in the process of curing. The surplus salt if saved, washed and dried can be used again as when the crystals have been purified by the removal of organic matter, the salt will be found to be as strong and good as when first used. This is well worth a trial, and the Board of Trade hopes that it will be taken up promptly. aug17,11


