## SAYS DEMPSEY WILL NOT FIGHT ABROAD.

Jack Kearns has reiterated his denial that Jack Dempsey, world's champion heavyweight boxer, would go to England to defend his title, with the declaration that he knew of no inducement that could persuade either himself or the champion to go across the Atlantic for a long time to come. He told friends that he did not believe there was enough money in England to arrange'a bout between Depmsey and some of the aspirants to Dempsey's championship.

This announcement by Dempsey's manager set at rest the current rumors both here and abroad that the champion would journey abroad within the near future. This rumor has been persistently growing in England, and recently a cablegram was received from England asking whether there was any truth in the report.
