KENT MURDER TRIAL.

Doctor's Testify to Kent's Blood-Stained Hands.

Rochester, N. Y., April 11.—The evidence in the Kent case yesterday was to the effect that there was no expression of pain on Miss Dingle's face when she was found with her throat cut, and the witnesses all were of the opinion that she had not moved after the wound was inflicted. This was deduced from the undisturbed condition of the bed clothes and the formation of the pools of blood. One witness testified that when Kent was being taken from the scene of the crime, he turned, went back to the bed, and leaning over the dead girl, cried, "Eh! Eh! My God, she can't be dead!" The bloody razor, a short blade, with shell handle, was produced and identified, as was also a hypodermic syringe. A physician testified that Kent's hands were covered with dried blood stains, and that there were many stains on the stand and bottles in the medicine case. District Attorney Warren produced several bottles and vials to be identified. It is alleged by the people's side that the latter were filled with laudanum when Kent and Miss Dingle first entered the room. The prosecution is endeavoring to prove its theory that Miss Dingle, dazed by liquor, was further plied with drugs, and that her throat was cut while in a comatose condition.

THE SHOOTING AT WALKERVILLE

It Is Asserted Kennedy Shot in Self-Defense.

WAS BEING MOBBED AT TIME

Statements by Eye-Witnesses of the Fatal Rioting in Detroit on Thursday.

Detroit, April 11.—The rioting of Thursday evening in connection with the Walkerville bridge works strike, is the chief topic of discussion here today. George E. Toehm, assistant civil engineer for the Walkerville bridge works, who lives at 301 Twenty-fifth street, was not more than 30 feet from Kennedy (the man who shot Michael Sullivan) when the crowd attacked the latter, and he saw everything that went on but the actual shooting. The affair completely unstrung his nerves, but he is able to give a good description of the fight.

"Kennedy was lying on the ground," he said, "when the shots were fired, and there must have been at least 20 or 25 men crowded around him and kicking him. They were so thick that I could not see Kennedy at all, and the shots sounded muffled. I counted four shots, and there may have been another. They followed one after another, but not so fast but that I had time to wonder where the lead was going, as I could not see how he could fire into the crowd without the bullets taking effect. I thought there was going to be trouble from the actions of the men on the boat. There was a full eight foot number of people on the trip, and the men were divided into little cliques. Kennedy had a tip that we were going to be attacked, but we were prepared for them on the other side with spears and officers, and the crowd did nothing more than yell. There were not more than a dozen of our employees on the boat, while I should say that there were at least 100 of the other men, but I saw only one striker on the boat, and he lives on this side.

"When the boat was pulling into the landing place I looked to see if there was a crowd waiting, but could not see any. Our men kept together, but the crowd rushed off first and forced them from the sidewalk into the street. I had my bicycle and was headed in the boat landed, began to throw mud and stones. Some of our men who were in front started to run, and then the fight began. A large number of men surrounded Kennedy, who had his revolver out, and he kept driving them away by hitting at them. Finally he fell backwards, but whether he tripped or was knocked down I do not know. I could see the men kicking at him, and then I heard the shots.

"At this the crowd parted, and I saw a man full over Kennedy's body and to his feet, with blood streaming down his face, but he did not fire again. He faced the crowd and then started to run, when the cry was raised, 'Best let him get away.' Several of the men took after him, but Kennedy ran over to an officer, who reached the corner, and was taken inside a saloon near the corner. The men surrounded the place, and one man went in the rear way, but he came out rather hurriedly, so I suppose the officer assisted his exit.

"It was lucky that Kennedy had a revolver, else he would have been murdered. The assault was absolutely unprovoked. "I want to emphasize the fact that Kennedy acted absolutely in self-defense, as will be clearly shown by those who witnessed the affair. Of late he has been in the works a good deal assisting in loading the cars, but that is clearly in the line of his work."
