London, May 3.-Curses on the weather expressed the uppermost emotion of the inhabitants of these islands a week ago. Eulogy on the same subject is the note of today. Penomenal brilliancy and have followed phenomenal gloom and have followed phenomenal gloom and cold. Forty degrees is the average dif-ference in the temperature of the last two days, as compared with the corre

sponding days last week. The hottest weather in all meteorological records for early May is contrasted with unprecedented cold for the last of April. English folk, on the whole, seem to be rather proud of these vagaries of their eccentric climate. They are quite sure even America could not beat their blizzard of a week ago, or excel the tor-

rid brilliancy of their May day.

A Transformation. The most extraordinary thing of all, however, was yesterday's transformation. London's dark, half-deserted streets, suddenly gave place to a dense throng of summer-costumed women. The whole metropolis hibernated throughout arctio April; the streets were almost impassable on the midsummery May day. It is easy to believe today that there are 6,000,000 people in town. A week ago one could go from end to end of Greater London with

out seeing 6,000 people. The spirits of the populace have risen in the same proportion as the thermometer. A week ago it would have been better to be dead in New York than alive in London. Well, the comparison might be variously interpreted, but nobody wants to be dead in London. Lightheartedness, straw hats, cool drinks and fans are the order of the day, and even politics is a less contentious subject than it was a

few days ago. The Liberals are taking their recent des feats with less discouragement than might be expected, yet the Unionists talk bravely about beating Churchill again, even in Dundee, with its 5,900 Radical majority. Asquith has rallied his followers with a fighting speech which aroused something like real enthusiasm.
