

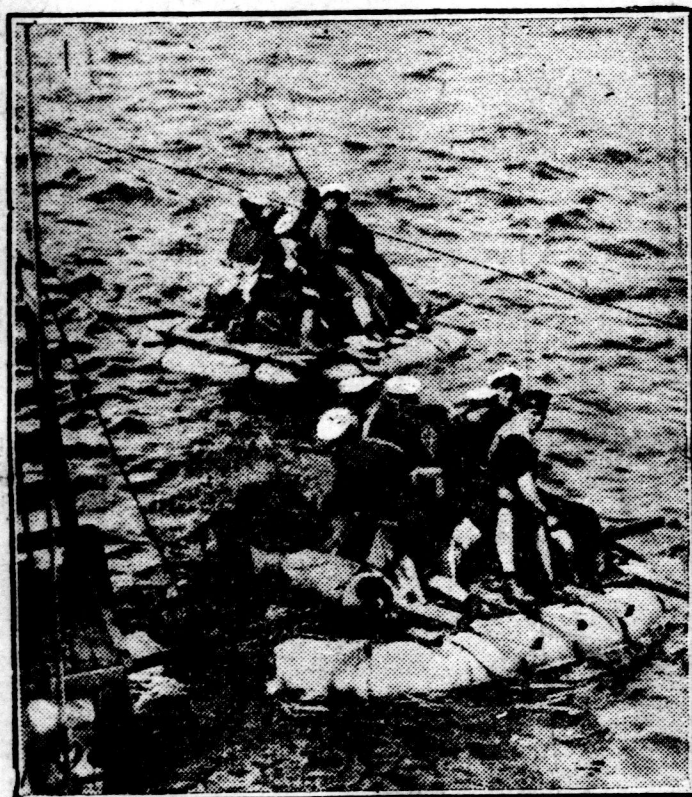
News of the World Near and Far Told By the Camera

Collins was slain a few days after the death of Griffith, by irreconcilable Republican guerrillas, who continue to terrorize Ireland in a determined effort to prevent the carrying out of the free state treaty as approved by a vast majority.

Gives Latest Fashion Hints.



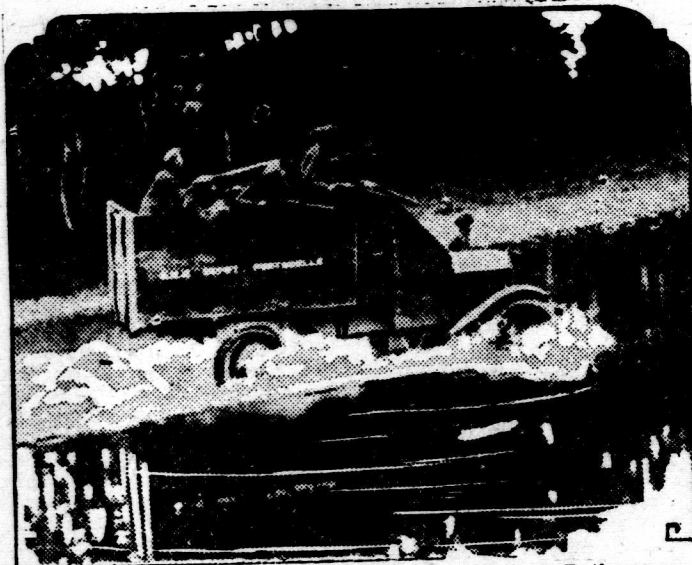
