Milton, July 31 .- In the third fatal level crossing accident in Central Ontario in three days, Alfred H Terrill and his aged father, James N. Terrill, were instantly killed at Anderson's crossing on the Second line, Trafalgar, west of Milton, this evening when the automobile in which they were riding was struck by an eastbound Canadian Pacific passenger
