

REBELS ARE DEFEATED

They are Driven From Tampico With 800 Men Killed.

Fierce Battle Ends In Repulse of Constitutionalist Forces, Who Withdraw Taking Locomotives and Cars From Railway Yard-Relief of City is Only Temporary and a Stronger Force is Expected.

MEXICO CITY, Dec., 15.—The rebels have failed in their attack on Tampico and have withdrawn some distance from he city.

Unofficial messager reaching here yesterday fully corroborate the War Office report of the robel defeat Saturday as a result of a heavy and sustained bombardment by two federal gumboats and federal field artillery. They do not, however, bear out the idea of a rout.

Holding possession of the railroad yards throughout the battle, the rebels, when they were driven off, remained sufficiently cool in the face of the furious fire, to take away with them every locomotive and most of the rolling stock.

According to the federal report eight hundred robels were killed before they could get out of range, and this would mean many other hundreds wounded and probably left behind.
