Gorman's second victory came close on the heels of the U. S. National Championship event which he won last week. Gorman won the 440 easy but a sprinter's pace was needed to win the longer distance because Charlie is a former peeler that he would win the longer distance. Gorman won the 3 mile event by a superhuman spirit in the final lap of the three mile event he staggered across the line ahead of the rest of the field although exhausted and won the coveted title. All skating fans will watch with interest his efforts at the Indoor Championships in St. John.




