WHAT IS GOING ON IN SPORTING CIRCLES THE WORLD OVER.

Season Tickets Schaefer and the Spectators to a Surprise Party—The Baseball Record to Date.

CHICAGO, May 31.—The second of the series of billiard games between Jacob Schaefer and George F. Slosson was played this evening at Central music hall, and attracted a large crowd. It was won by Slosson in 77 innings. It was a champion's game of 800 points. Schaefer led easily from the start, playing a strong though not particularly brilliant game. At the end of the 25th inning the score stood Slosson 434, Schaefer 615. Slosson up to that time played a very poor game, missing some of the most easy shots on the table, and with the exception of one run in the 21st inning of 137 and one of 138 in the 19th inning, he played a poor and slightly nervous game. By this time the spectators had given the game up in favor of Schaefer. In the 20th inning Slosson made a run of 236, and the next inning followed it up with a run of 110, running the game out. He was picked up and carried about the hall by his friends. There was not much betting on the game. Schaefer's score was 633.

The billiard match between Schaefer and Slosson in Chicago Saturday evening is what may be termed the rectangular triangular game. The fact of the game is that the player to keep away from the lines, while in the other game it is his purpose to hug the lines as closely as possible, and to get back to a high average is the difficulty of getting the ball started into a running position. The game is practically longer than a continuous ball game, and is a matter of position, and yet really too short to be a satisfactory test of skill as a whole such experts as Schaefer and Slosson.

"Though Lost to Sight, to Memory Dear."

To the Editor of the Detroit Free Press. The New York Observer of July 4, 1878, contained a letter from John Bartlett of Cambridge, Mass., in which he said that the above line was contained in a song composed for and sung by Mr. Augustus Brahan; that the words and music were by George Linley, who died in 1865, and that it was set to music and published by Cramer, Beale & Co. of London about 1848. While the Examiner of July 20, 1878, has it that "it has at length been discovered to be the first line of a song by a late English composer, George Linley, who died in 1865. Again another authority states that the authorship has been largely accredited to Mr. Churchill Mason, and goes on to declare his belief that it originated with Ruthven Jenkins, and occurs in a poem which was first published in the Green which magazine for marines in 1701 or 1702 concerning thus: "Sweetheart, good-bye! the fluttering sail is spread to waft me far from thee. And soon before the fast'ning gale my ship shall bound upon the sea. Perchance all dost and art forgotten. These eyes shall miss thee many a year, But unto golden even charm thee, though lost to sight, to memory dear." And I may here remark that the song, composed and sung by Brahan and published by Cramer, does not contain these lines.
