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MERCHANTS BANK OF CANADA

Annual Meeting of Shareholders at Montreal.

An Able Address by the General Manager: A Comprehensive Review of the Financial and Commercial Position of the Bank.

The annual meeting of the Merchants Bank of Canada was held at the head office in Montreal on June 15. The annual report of the directors showed the net profit of the bank to have been \$2,000,000, of which seven per cent dividends had been paid.

The President called upon Mr. W. N. Anderson to act as secretary of the meeting. The Secretary being called upon read the advertisement calling the meeting.

The Directors of the Merchants Bank of Canada have pleasure in reporting to the shareholders as follows: The net profit of the year, after providing for all contingencies, was \$2,000,000.

The position of the bank as a whole is shown in the statement of liabilities and assets submitted. The bank has done a satisfactory business during the year, and realized a net profit exceeding that of last year by nearly \$1,000,000.

It will be seen by comparing the balance sheet of last year with that of the present year that the circulation of the bank has been maintained. Deposits at the date of the present balance sheet show a slight reduction, but taking the average of the whole year very little difference is shown.

The principal duties of the working of the bank between last year and this was in the steadily increasing line of mercantile deposits. While the total of these was \$13,000,000, the amount shown on the balance sheet is \$13,000,000, or \$940,000 more.

As the means of the bank were more and more required for purposes of mercantile business, the funds employed in the purchase of bonds and stocks were drawn upon, so that at the present they show a diminution of \$700,000. This brings about an increased position to the bank.

The board have had pleasure in watching the gradual and steady growth of the 'Rest' of the bank from year to year, and the stockholders will be gratified by finding that the net profit of the bank for the year just closed, after writing off bad debts and making a large allowance for contingencies, this brings up the total profit of the year to \$2,000,000.

The important subject of a pension fund for the officers of the bank has engaged the attention of the Board during the year, and they have taken part in presenting an act to the directors now before the Parliament in Ottawa.

The General Manager's term of service has recently expired. The Board has succeeded in securing a new General Manager, Mr. J. H. Macdonald, who has been in the service of the bank for many years.

The officers of the bank have discharged their duties with ability and to the satisfaction of the board, and the directors have had the pleasure of distributing \$12,000,000 amongst them in the shape of a bonus.
