The condition of affairs in Wall-street noted in our last weekly advices predisposed the market to sympathize quickly with any adverse conditions and week has furnished such conditions. to sympathize quickly with any adverse concitions. The past week has furnished such contions, and stocks have consequently been weatened, prices generally showing moderate delines. The reduction of ½ per cent in the quaterly dividend of Chicago, Burlington & Quin had a demoralizing effect on the granger stock generally, as it strengthened a prevalent doul about the ability of that group of roads to main tain their late rate of dividends. Another use favorable symptom respecting the western reast

about the ability of that group of roads to maintain their late rate of dividends. Another unfavorable symptom respecting the western roads was forthcoming in the form of an application for a receiver for the Louisville, New Albany & Chicago Railroad. The suspension of the American Loan & Trust Company and unfounded rumors about the standing of other minor trust institutions have produced an unfavorable impression; whilst the continued high rates for sterling exchange and the taking out some \$600,000 of gold for export have affected the market adversely.

Thursday's statement of the Bank of England was better than expected. Although within the week the bank has paid a second million of the three millions sterling borrowed from the Bank of France, yet its specie declined only. £640,000, and no change was made in the rate of discount, which had been expected to be put up ½ to 1 percent. A London dispatch says: "The Bank of England continues to realize on the assets of the Barings. This polity has a tendency to ease the linancial situation, and in the end will inure to the cheapness of money." This opinion seems o chime with the general expectation.

The local money market retains its late ease, but the banks have lost nearly \$3,000,000 during he week on their exchanges with the sub-treaury and \$600,000 through export of gold, whilst a their transactions with the interior they have aimed a small amount.
