This truly great invention renders the Pocket Gold Pen perfect, and is invariably considered as the great desideratum fully attained. Its advantages over the ordinary pen are:

1st—As a perfect substitute for the Pocket Inkstand.

2nd—As an improved dip pen.
3rd—Its use with or without the Fountain.
4th—The adaptation of the holder to any pen.

5th—Its use both as a pocket and desk pen.
6th—The nib will hold three times the quantity of ink of the ordinary pen, thus rendering the

metalic or gold pen perfect in use.

This pen is particularly useful to travellers—and all persons who use pocket inkstands—and equally useful to all who use the pocket pen, as the Fountain does not interfere with its use as an ordinary dip pen—it is rather an advantage. The construction is simple, and the Fountain easily managed.

The pens are warranted equal to any in use. If a person has a pen already which pleases him, he can purchase the Fountain Holder, and use his own pen.

The following description of its construction, with reference to the accompanying engraving, will

give a general understanding of its mechanism, and the manner of its operation :-

The body of the article is a hollow, six-sided cylinder, into which is fitted an elastic packed piston, which works on a screw rod attached to a revolving head at the upper end. From the lower end descends a small tube, having a curved point resting upon the blade of the pen. The cap, or tube that covers the pen when not in use, is taken off and applied to the revolving head at the upper end, which by turning, raises or lowers the piston, injecting or ejecting the ink according to the direction in which it is turned
