ANALYSIS OF SPEECH SOUNDS

or the genesis of sounds by the relativ positions of the organs of speech is very interesting. The vowel scale submitted by Mrs Burnz is a very practical one. Why shud we 'invent' new expedients and new letrs when we hav familiar symbols redy to hand for evry simpl and compound vowel sounds? as

DITHONGS

do not need to hav their elements defined with scientific precision. Theoris vary considerably, for instance, as to components of *ei* in *eider* and of *ow* in *owl*. The practical result is not afected by the theory: we hav easily recognized sounds associated with these symbols. While analysis is most interesting to the scientist, it does not tuch practical fonetics.

PAIRING VOWELS

is not necessary in a practical working alfabet. It wud be dificult perhaps to find an exact pair of vowel sounds, long and short. [The foloing arises from our statement on p. 50 that, excepting certan peculiaritis, American speech is comparativly homogeneous, or free from dialect. By request, and for experimenter's sake, it is put in an old-lett plan favored by M. Part of the reasons for M's chois may be inferd from what he has ritn page 49. *U* or *uw* is used for *I*, *y* for the vowel in *eel*, *er* or *er* for that in *ail*, *uu* and *wo* for those in *ooze* and *owl* respectivly.]

Dhi numter ov dialektz and influensez advers tu pyuriti is infiniti greiter dhan in dhi mudher kuntri, dher bying Nygro, German, Italian, several Skandinevian, Rushyen (Menonuit), Chuiyng, Indyan, and udher foren, besuidz Nyuu Ingglond or "Yangky," sudhern or western, ol syuperated tu dhi Ingglisch, Skotish, and Uriish dialekts brot intu dhi kuntri buy imigrants. In dhi mudher kuntri, dhi spgch ov edykeited pgpl duz not differ mor wuidli dhan on dhis kontinent; it tendz mor and mor tu asimileishun, and dhi veri naewnes ov dheir limits renderz dhi proses mor gzi. It iz dhi perfekshun ov dhi modez ov spgch ov meni diferent pgpl ol ov huum hav olweyz spoken Ingglisch; and it is dhi spgch whicx is tu-dey folowd buy edykeited spgkerz thruuwt dhi Ingglisch-spgking werld.
