





QUILLAIA TOOTHWASH.—An excellent toothwash containing glycerine is taade as follows:—R. soap bark, ground, 4 ounces; glycerine, 3 ounces; diluted alcohol, sufficient for 2 pints; oil of gaultheria, oil of peppermint, 20 drops. Macerate the scap bark in the mixture of glycerine and diluted alcohol for three or four days, and filter through a little magnesia previously triturated with the volatile oils. Thus made, a much better preparation is obtained than by macerating the bark in the dilute alcohol, and adding the glycerine afterwards.

How Lives are Shortened.—Dr. Stephen Smith says the most important of the general conditions which shorten life in our day is excessive expenditure of vital force. This may occur in various ways. In the young, if food is improper or clothing insufficient, renewal does not take place at an age when the expenditure for growth is greatest, and exhaustion rapidly follows. At maturny the passions ripen into activity and have their full play, and if not suitably controlled afford large and exhaustive expenditure of vital power. Among the poor, life force is often exhausted in the struggle for food, and among the rich in the struggle for the luxuics, wealth, position and power. Here, owing to wear and tear from abrievy loss of sleep and the concomitants, life are digestion and assimilation, waste excess supply, and exhaustion exceeds trace at. To the general causes of waste we would add impute air of dwellings, impriparly prepared foods, inchrictly, gluttony, social dissipations, and ten thousand nameless sources of constant impairment of the vital functions, without power of suitable renewal, which fill up the measure of man's daily life in modern society. Over nearly all of these conditions man may, if he will, exert most arbitrary control. He can feed and clothe the young, old, and helpless; he can moderate his passions to a healthful play; he can so regulate his habus as to secure a proportionate expenditure and renewal of vital energy; in his food, in his drink, in his home, and at his business he can be well nigh master of everything that affects his well-being. With all this power, why such failure? We answer, ignorance. The people at large do not know, much less realize, the extent to which they may control their own longevity. Even the higher citeles of society are ignorant of the nature, whethe for good or evil, of the air they breathe, the clothes they wear. Nay more, the medical profession is so devoted sick, that it does not sickness, methods of preventing sickness.
