That the Home Mission Committee of the Western Section, in conjunction with the Presbytery of Manitoba, are instructed to prepare a code of sules for the guidance of the Superint indent of Missions in the prosecution of his work, said sules to be reported for approval to the next General Assembly 4. That Dr. Cochrane, the converter of the Home Mission Committee for the Western Section, and Mr. George Brues, along with any other member of the Home Mission Committee for the Western Section, and Mr. George Brues, along with any other member of the Home Mission Committee for Superintendent of Missions, and also confer with the Presbytery on the installation of Mr. Robertson to the office of Superintendent of Missions, and also confer with the Presbytery in regard to other matters affecting our mission work in the North-West Territories.
