given to the misappriberaions of the abolitionists, fechnically so called, whoh affords any sufficient reason for refusing to hold commonion with thom as churches of Christ; and that therefore it is our duty to improve the opening which, in Piovi. dence, has occurred for promoting fricndly Christian intercourso with thess churches.
Dr. Candlish, on the contrary, has taken a decided ground, that either the funds shonld be rolurned, or be recelved under protest agabust slavery.-N. Y. Evangelist.

I'us Balthore Methodist Conference. - It has transpred, notwithetandmg its sittug with closed dowrs, that the subyect of shevery hus bern considered by this Confercuce, and very hounorably and decidedly disposed of. Four of tho bishops were present The subject came up in two forms: ono, in the case of the Rev. Mr. Marding, who was tried and deposed by an inferior judicatory, for linding slaves-a thing forbidden to the ministry by the discipline of the church. It was decided by a very large majority, 1.18 to 13 , that the decision of the lower Conference be sustained, until Mr. Hardang shall execute at derd of manumission to all his slaves. The other point was the cone sideration of the proposal to rescind the sixth restriction rule, which would allow a division of funds in case of a division of the church on account of slavery. The question has been regarded, wherever acted on, as indicative of the fecling on the subject of a division for slavery's salke. At this Conference, the proposal 10 rescind was negatived by the strong vote of 150 to 11. This action, as well as the courage and good feeling evinced in the entertaining of the subject, does the Methodist denomination distinguished honour. We hope that other de. nominations of evangelical Chrstians will suffer themselves to be provoked to good works by the example.-1b.
