## FRUITS.

Apples.-Sales of round lots reported of winter fruit at \$2 25 to \$2.50 per barrel.

Lemons.-Sales have taken place at the fol-lowing prices :-Cases \$7.00 to \$7.50; boxes \$3 00 to \$4 00.
