Annual Meeting of the Province of Quebec Rifle Association.

The annual meeting of the association was held on the Cote St. Luke Ranges during the matches, on the 15th Aug. The meeting, at which the attendance was not large, was in no way noticeable except for the rapid way in which what business there was to transact was gotten through. The following is a summary of the proceedings.

Were present Lieut.-Col. Houghton, president of the council, in the chair; Lieut.-Col. Gray, Lieut.-Col. Starke, Lieut.-Col. Hood, Majors Sims, Radiger, Blaiklock, Roy, Bond, Captain Pope, Lieutenants Desbarats and W. M. Andrews and Messrs. R. Binmore and Arthur Ware.

After the minutes were approved the election of officers for the ensuing year took place. Sir Donald A. Smith was unanimously re-elected president, but when it came to the question of the four vice-presidents many of those present said that a change was necessary in some respects, and the provincial grant, which the association did not get, was also a subject of remark in this connection. No objections were made to the re-election of Lieut.-Col. McEachern and Brosseau, but for the other two a change was demanded, with the result that, on motion of Lieut.-Col. Starke, seconded by Capt. Pope, Lieut.-Col. White, 8th Royal Rifles, Quebec, was elected third vice-president.

Then, on motion of Mr. Arthur Ware, seconded by Major Blaiklock, Mr. Morris, M. L. A., was elected for the other office.

The election for members of the council then took place. Lieut.-Col. Starke, D. T. Fraser, Majors Bond, Blaiklock and A. H. Sims were re-elected, and Lieut.-Col. Gray, F. Desbarats and Captain Finlayson will be the new members. Under the head of general business, Major Blaiklock expressed regret that more of the members, even those on the ranges,
