Democratic Republic of Vietnam, the other party to the Cease-Fire Agreement. The views of the Canadian Delegation, in this respect, are set forth fully in the Minutes of the Extraordinary Meeting which took place on May 9.

The Canadian Delegation does not agree that Article 21 is applicable to the Svay Rieng case since this is a minor border incident between two sovereign countries and cannot be considered "a resumption of hostilities". In the opinion of the Canadian Delegation, hostilities can only be "resumed" if the two parties to the Agreement (which was designed to bring about a Cease-Fire in Cambodia between two opposing forces) were to take any action which could be considered a violation or threat of violation upon one or the other's territory. respect to the competence of the Commission
