AUSTRALIA: BASIC DATA

GEOGRAPHY Australia has a total land area of 2,970,000 square miles (7,700,000 kilometres),

with approximately 40 percent of the land mass within the tropics. Mainland Australia is mostly a flat and low-lying land, the center of which consists of vast,

arid desert.

CLIMATE The capital cities and coastal areas of the temperate zones, where most of the

population lives, enjoy pleasant climates with long hours of sunshine and mild winters. However, Darwin, Brisbane and Sydney tend to be hot and humid in

summer.

CURRENCY The currency is the Australian dollar (A\$), and is divided into 100 units (cents,¢).

As at 30 September, 1994, the rate of exchange was \$CDN1 = 1.028\$AUD.

HOLIDAYS The number of statutory holidays varies from state to state. Holidays observed

throughout Australia are as follows: January 1, Australia Day (January 26), Good

Friday, Easter Monday, April 25, Queen's Birthday, December 25 and 26.
