IL EST ORDONNÉ,—Que, conformément à son Ordre de renvoi du mardi 1<sup>er</sup> mars 1983, il soit accordé au Comité spécial sur la réforme des pensions (groupe de travail) les pouvoirs que donne l'article 69(8) du Règlement aux Comités permanents; et en outre, que lesdits pouvoirs soient réputés lui avoir été accordés dès sa création.

ATTESTÉ:

(1) the changes proposed in the current pension system contained in the Canada Pension Plan; (2) the changes proposed in the current pension system including the issue of expanding mandatory pension arrangements to enable Canadians to have a better distribution of their living standards through their employment; (3) the nature of any expansion of the current pension system through the issue of expanding mandatory pension arrangements to enable Canadians to have a better distribution of their living standards through their employment; (4) the financing of the Canada Pension Plan; (5) the proposal to overcome the special problems facing women, including harassment, under the current pension system provided that changes in membership of the committee be made only pursuant to Standing Order 69(4)(b); That the provisions of section (8) of Standing Order 69 be suspended in application to the Special Committee; That the Special Committee have the power to retain the services of expert, professional, technical and clerical staff as may be deemed necessary; That the Special Committee hold hearings and receive views and representation from interested groups and individuals across Canada and that for this purpose, the Special Committee and its members have the power, when the Special Committee deems it necessary to adjourn from place to place or travel inside Canada, provided the estimated expenses for such travel and the locations to be visited are defined in advance and that, when deemed necessary, the required staff accompany the Special Committee or its members; That notwithstanding the usual practice of the House, if the House is not sitting when an interim or final report of the Special Committee is completed, the Special Committee may make the said report public before it is laid before the House; and That the Special Committee shall report no later than December 31, 1983.
