However, before concluding my remarks I should like to say that I fully support that reduction by which our young people may be able to play a leading role and contribute to the common weal. I might undoubtedly take inspiration from that thought of Jean-Charles Harvey, and I should have liked to be able to emphasize a little the problems facing our young people in Quebec today as well as the part they want to play.

I think that we must take as a pattern a constructive dialogue so that the Quebec young people may associate themselves to those of other provinces, on a federal level, so that we may work closely with all the classes of our society.

We must hope for this, and young people today should meditate on this question. A great man once said that political genius, like any other, really consists in making rational use of the genius of others.

I believe in the intelligence of our youth. I am sure that, together with Canadians of every social class, our young people will find inspiration in Man and his World and build a future in which liberty, unity and fraternity

will reign, in a new world, in a strong and better Canada.
