It is a sense of lack of access to social institutions, private and public. It is a sense of alienation from established political functions. It is a lack of awareness of the rich potential of urban life. It is a lack of influence over one's surroundings.

In the approaches we have taken in the past we have virtually ignored all the opportunities which exist within the housing stock we have, within the given hardware, to enrich urban life by policies which encourage Canadians to define their interests and to relate more to each other.
