The Assistant Deputy Chairman: The hon. member wanted to know the clauses which are stood.

Mr. Knowles (Winnipeg North Centre): Start with No. 4.

The Assistant Deputy Chairman: Clauses 4, 7, 9, 35, 37, 43.1, and 52 as amended.

Mr. Turner (Ottawa-Carleton): Madam Chairman, was clause 80 agreed upon?

The Assistant Deputy Chairman: There is no record of clause 80 standing.

Mr. Knowles (Winnipeg North Centre): Is there a record that it was agreed upon?

Mr. Stevens: I believe that the intention was to stand clause 80.

The Assistant Deputy Chairman: Clause 80 was stood.

Mr. Paproski: Madam Chairman, could we have those numbers repeated?

The Assistant Deputy Chairman: Clauses 4, 7, 9, 35, 37, new clause 43.1, clause 52 and clause 80.

Mr. Knowles (Winnipeg North Centre): Madam Chairman, may we have confirmation of what has been under-

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stood? On Monday will we be dealing with Bill C-49 in committee, beginning with clause 4?

Mr. Turner (Ottawa-Carleton): Yes, that is so. It is our understanding that clause 52, which has been stood, was stood because of a sidebar heading which, in the minds of some hon. members, related to resources. It really does not relate to resources.

Mr. Paproski: I agree, Madam Chairman. I think that clause 52 could be carried, if we could revert to it.

The Assistant Deputy Chairman: Is it agreed that we revert to clause 52, as amended?

Some hon. Members: Agreed.

Clause 52 as amended agreed to.

The Assistant Deputy Chairman: It being five o'clock it is my duty to rise, report progress, and request leave to consider the bill again at the next sitting of the House.

Progress reported.

The Acting Speaker (Mrs. Morin): It being five o'clock the House stands adjourned until Monday at 2 p.m.

At 5 p.m. the House adjourned, without question put, pursuant to Standing Order.
