When the soul is entirely consecrated and each faculty performing its particular function, the will of God will be a pleasure. Sorrow, pain and death will have lost their sting, and the joy of the Lord will be the strength of the soul. What God wills is best, and the soul would not wish to have it otherwise. Prosperity and adversity are alike good. The language of
