

and the Society may take steps to promote the study of History and Science by lectures and other means.

ARTICLE II.—MEMBERS.

The Society shall consist of active, corresponding and honorary members.

Active members shall consist of persons residing in the Province of Manitoba.

Corresponding members shall be persons residing elsewhere, who feel an interest in the Society and its objects, and are willing to aid it by representing it in their vicinity and procuring donations for its library and museum.

Honorary members shall consist more particularly of persons whose careers have been associated with the history of the Dominion of Canada, in trade, explorations, science, art, literature or missionary labors.

ARTICLE III.—ELECTION OF MEMBERS.

No person shall hereafter be elected a member unless proposed and seconded at a regular meeting of the Society or Executive Council, and balloted for at the next succeeding meeting of the Society, and one negative vote on every five cast shall exclude the candidate.

ARTICLE IV.—FEES AND DUES.

Each active member shall on admission pay four dollars in full of entrance fee and all dues for the first year, which shall be enclosed with the application for membership, and shall pay two dollars yearly thereafter.
