LAYING THE FOUNDATION STONE.

His Excellency the Governor General, having graciously acceded to the request of the Council, that he would lay the Foundation Stone of the new Building, Tuesday next, the 13th instant, has been fixed for the ceremony.

The Members of the Institute are requested to assemble in the grounds of Moss Park, at half-past two o'clock, to proceed from thence to the site, on Pembroke Street, there to await the arrival of His Excellency.

G. W. Allan, Esq., Vice-President, having invited the Members to a conversazione at Moss Park, in the evening, from 8 to half-past 10 o'clock, Dr. Boyell and Professors Croft, Irving, Cherriman, and Hineks, will exhibit illustrations of Natural History, with the aid of the microscope; and Communications will be read by Paul Kane, Esq., on "The manners and Customs of the North American Indians;" and by Dr. D. Wilson, on "Some peculiar virtues and historical associations of the Canadian and English Maple."
