FEAR COLD WAVE IN WHEAT BELT

Bulge at Chicago Reflected Apprehension—Corn Sold Up Sharply.

CHICAGO, Jan. 28.—A fear that a predicted cold wave might bring disaster to the winter crop had a good deal to do today with a bulge in the price of wheat.
