

### THOROUGHbred CATTLE—EXPORT TO UNITED STATES—*Con.*

*Henderson, David* (Halton)—2767.

National Live Stock Convention in Ottawa—2767. Opportune time to call attention to fee imposed on thoroughbred cattle entering the United States from Canada—2767. Practically a guarantee—2767. Have steps been taken to remove this unjust restriction—2767.

*Staples, W. D.* (Macdonald)—2769.

Government should retaliate by adopting a regulation similar to that in force in the United States—2768.

### THROWING OFF MAIL AT PAKENHAM, ONT.

Attention called to mutilation of mail—Mr. R. L. Borden—1425.

*Borden, R. L.* (Carleton, Ont.)—1425.

Calls attention to the mutilation of mail by falling under the wheels of the train—1425.

*Lemieux, Hon. Rodolphe* (Postmaster General)—1425.

First time his attention has been called to it, will see that it is remedied at once—1425.

### TIMBER BERTHS.

Several motions, amended and passed—849.

*Boyce, A. C.* (Algoma)—810.

Perhaps the minister would not object to this order with the same amendment—850.

*Luke, R. S.* (Qu'Appelle)—849.

Considers the production of the original papers important, but will amend his motion if the minister desires—849.

*Oliver, Hon. Frank* (Minister of the Interior)—849.

Has no objection if the motion is amended as suggested—849-50.

*White, G. V.* (North Renfrew)—850.

Makes this motion with the same amendment—850.

### TIMBER LIMITS—DISPOSAL OF NORTH-WEST.

*Conmee, James* (Thunder Bay and Rainy River)—2345.

Mackenzie government did not put public lands in position when they could be obtained without competition—2345. Conservative government parcelled out lands in western Ontario—2345.

*Haggart, Hon. John* (South Lanark)—2339.

Timber limit policies of the past—2340-41. Licenses cancelled—2341. His personal connection with limits—2341-42. Mackenzie government took away competition or tendering for limits—2342. Timber dues not increased since 1879—2345. Business principles should be applied to dealing with limits, and embodied in a Bill—2445.

### TIMBER LIMITS—DISPOSAL OF NORTH-WEST—*Con.*

*McIntyre, Wilbert* (Strathcona)—2327.

Methods of government in dealing with timber lands superior to those followed by Conservatives—2327. Influence, in-endo and supposition form basis of attack on government's administration—no facts—2328-29. Question of competition—2330. Purchaser of limits pays both rental on ground and so much per thousand feet for timber cut—2331. Changes in regulations at various times—2333. Contrasts Liberal and Conservative policies—2334-2338.

*Perley, Geo. H.* (Argenteuil)—2310.

Silence of ministers during this debate—2310. Right of renewals to owners of limits—2311. Notice regarding sales—2312. Prefers reserve bid to upset price—2313. Special sales of limits—2314. Big River limits—2314-17. Timber should not be sold till actually needed—2317-18. Objectionable methods of selling timber berths—2318-19. Small operator has no chance to bid—2319. Value of limits should be known before being offered for sale—2320. Suspicious circumstances in connection with opening tenders—2321. No open competition—2321. Timber lienses issued by Conservative government—2322-23. Compares Dominion government policy with policy in force in Ontario and Quebec—2323-25. Remedies that might be applied—2325-26. Papers brought down point to crookedness in connection with disposal of timber limits—2327. An investigation necessary—2327.

### TIMBER MARKING ACT AMENDMENT.

Introduction of Bill (No. 193)—Hon. Sydney Fisher—11120.

*Fisher, Hon. Sydney* (Minister of Agriculture)—11120.

Object of amendment is to make the Act apply to New Brunswick—11120.

### TOBACCO—USE OF—BY YOUNG PERSONS.

Consideration of Senate amendments, Bill 173—Hon. A. B. Aylesworth—13044.

*Aylesworth, Hon. A. B.* (Minister of Justice)—13044.

The most important amendment is the reduction of the age limit—13044. This latter provision does not add anything to the general law—13045.
