

pupils, and without any interference with the lesson of the day.

The constant aim should be, not only to instruct the pupils with regard to the facts, principles and claims of missions, but also to stimulate their missionary enthusiasm, to lead them to think habitually on the subject, and to make missions an object of their prayers and of their beneficence. If all this is done, cases of personal consecration to missionary service will not be rare among the members of the School.

CHAPTER XX.

THE CRADLE ROLL AND HOME DEPARTMENT

The Cradle Roll

This represents the interest taken by the Sunday School in those who are not yet old enough to attend its sessions. Its purpose is to extend the benefits of the church and School, so far as possible, to the babies and small children, and to widen the influence of the church and School, by bringing them and the home into more intimate relation.

All who are too young to attend the School are eligible for membership in the Cradle Roll. Infant children of those who are members or adherents of the church, or who are not connected with any other, may, with the consent of the parents, be placed upon the Roll, and a Certificate of Membership given.

The child's full name, residence and date of birth, should be placed upon the record book kept for that purpose in the School. Visits should be made to the homes of these children as often as may be appropriate, by those in charge of this department. The pastor and superintendent should be furnished with their names and addresses.
